• 1 Overview

- 1.1 You'll create a slide for your course lecture that provides a visual explanation. In addition, you'll write a learning objective for your lecture lesson plan that your slide supports. You'll present your learning objective and presentation slide to our workshop group.

• 2 Objectives

- 2.1 Write a learning objective for your course lecture lesson plan.
- 2.2 Create a presentation slide using the Assertion-Evidence format for your course lecture.
- 2.3 Create a visual explanation with PowerPoint's "SmartArt" graphics tool for your course lecture.

• 3 Instructions

- 3.1 Write a learning objective for your activated lecture. You'll use this learning objective to guide the construction of your visual explanation.
 - 3.1.1 A learning objective specifies in measurable terms what the learner will know or be able to do as a result of the activated lecture. Verbs with meanings like "know" or "understand" are hard to observe in your students. You probably have something more specific in mind! This will help you as you think about how your students will be assessed.
 - 3.1.2 A learning objective starts with "The student will be able to..." + measurable verb. Example: "Student will be able to create a presentation slide using the Assertion-Evidence format."
 - 3.1.3 Good verbs include: recall, identify, recognize, translate, transform, apply, operate, analyze, classify, distinguish, specify, build, measure, verify, check, etc. List of verbs available online at: <http://cte.illinois.edu/resources/topics/syllabus/blooms.html>
- 3.2 Create a presentation slide that displays your learning objective.
 - 3.2.1 A simple slide that displays your learning objective. You'll be able to use this slide to show your learning objective statement to the rest of the class.
- 3.3 Create a presentation slide
 - 3.3.1 If you're using PowerPoint, try out the "SmartArt" easy graphic organizers.
 - 3.3.2 If appropriate, give your slide a full-sentence assertion, like "Water goes in a cycle" or "The water cycle has 5 steps."
- 3.4 Share your learning objective and presentation slide with the workshop group
